

The Green Building Rating System of the German Sustainable Building Council (DGNB) offers an internationally recognized benchmark for the sustainable design, construction and operation of buildings. DGNB was developed in Germany and is currently applied in the form of partnerships from Central and Eastern Europe to China for the certification of buildings. The Green Building Rating System DGNB is adapted and managed on a country-specific basis by the partner organizations ÖGNI (in Austria) and SGNI (in Switzerland).



The certification levels are determined by the total of achievable evaluation points in five categories together with the evaluation of the location:
